#### MONROE CITY'S BATTLING BLUE JEANS OF 1948-49

The 1948-49 basketball season was historical for Monroe City High School - enrollment 116.

With several players returning from the season before, hopes were high in Harrison Township in southern Knox County.

Prior to Maurice Sakel's initial year at MC he had played basketball at Evansville college, played pro ball for 2 years and had coached one year at Red Bay, Alabama before registering a six year 95-46 tabulation at Ellettsville.

Sakel's Blue Jeans started with 7 wins. The next match up was with the, also undefeated, Winstow Eskimos led by Dick Kinder, Gene Northerner and the future I.U. star Dick Farley. Monroe City went down to its first defeat by two points in a nerve shattering overtime game. Winslow would not lose again until their 1949 sectional final defeat by the Jasper Wildcats.

After this bump in the road and another one point loss to Montgomery, the Blue Jeans then 10-2 headed for the annual mid-January Wabash Valley Tournament, the largest non-state tourney in America. The Illinois and Indiana teams entered this year totaled 108.

Monroe City easily won the preliminary round at the Vincennes Coliseum, beating three teams by a total of 163 to 84 points, thus advancing to the 16 team finals at Indiana State in Terre Haute. But before the finals, a regular season game with Bicknell had been previously scheduled. MC tried to reschedule the contest because Coach Sakel

didn't want his boys to have to play on a Tuesday and then possibly have four games on the following Friday and Saturday. Bicknell refused. So rather than forfeit, the game was played; but Coach Sakel refused to play more than one starter at a time. Therefore, it was basically Bicknell's first five versus Monroe City's second five, thus the 13 point loss.

In the finals the Blue Jeans blistered Graysville by 25, Bruceville by 18, Gosport by 19, and against Attica, Larry Teverbaugh scored 18 to lead the team. In that title game, the Red Ramblers were topped 52-43. This became the first of two Valley championships – the second coming in 1967 under the guidance of Sam Alford.

Bruceville and Attica each came in with one loss prior to their contests with Monroe City. Bruceville's star player and later successful coach was Basil Sfreddo.

MC's 6-4 center Bill Sutton won the mental attitude award usually given to the tourney's most valuable player. Sutton would be the leading scorer and rebounder for Monroe City for the entire season. Sutton along with Berry and Teverbaugh were all-tourney selections, and the way the team ran over its opponents in the tourney brought them state-wide attention.

MC's journey toward the sectional continued with 5 more wins to claim its first conference title with no team coming closer than 12 points.

Going into the sectional at Vincennes, Monroe City had won 9 games in a row and 13 out of their last 14 games. Their overall slate stood at 22-3, the most wins of any team in the state.

Hope was high, but the Blue Jean faithful knew their school had never won a sectional. They drew the long route to the title. It would take four wins in three days to annex the crown.

Monroe took out the Wheatland Jeeps by 16 behind Bill Sutton's 24 points. Oaktown was easily dismissed by 35 and Fritchton by 11 with Sutton and Doyle Nelson getting 17 and 13 points respectively. This produced the game that Indiana high school basketball enthusiasts all over southwestern Indiana had been hoping for: Monroe City and the host Vincennes Alices for all the sectional marbles.

There must have been a certain amount of anxiety present among the MC faithful

because, as previously mentioned, their Blue Jeans had never won a sectional nor had they ever beaten the Alices who pretty much had dominated the sectional by winning 21 of the last 26 events.

At the half Vincennes led 22-17. At the end of three the gap had been narrowed to 4. In the final quarter MC came roaring back and took the lead for good on a basket by Don Berry and a free throw by Bob Small to give the Blue Jeans the heart stopping

victory 49-48. Teverbaugh, Sutton and Berry were the top scorers.

The following Saturday afternoon, in the first game back at the Vincennes Coliseum, saw MC matched with Loogootee's Lions. A starter for the Lions was none other than Jack Butcher who would later go on to become the winningest coach in Indiana high school basketball history. The second game pitted Jasper against the Shelburn Panthers.

Loogootee and Monroe City battled tooth-and-nail through one overtime with the Blue Jeans prevailing by a point on a basket by Doyle Nelson. Unfortunately, Don Berry, the team's second leading scorer and best outside shooter, injured his knee. The second contest saw Jasper defeat Shelburn's Panthers 61-52.

In the championship game, with Berry seeing very limited action, the Blue Jeans led the Wildcats 32-23 at the half and 40-33 at the end of three. But in the fourth quarter Jasper started closing the gap. Still trailing with two minutes remaining, these neversay-die Jasper Wildcats, as they had and would the entire tournament, eventually eked out a 57-55 blockbuster win over one of Indiana's great small school quintets.

The Wildcats would go on to take the state championship after losing 9 regular season games, but the MC Blue Jeans gave the Cats all they could handle. Monroe City won the first of the school's three sectionals (the others coming in '53 and '61), won its first conference title, won the first of two Wabash Valley championships (the other in a deluted 21 team event in 1967), and compiled a glittering 27-4 record.

# WHEN FICTION BECOMES FACT OR FACT BECOMES FICTION

Everyone knows the numbers 9,325 and 8,996. They top the list of largest gyms for Indiana and the world. I was imagining the ramifications if neither was correct. What if New Castle isn't biggest? That's what I was doing as I boarded an ATA flight in Fort Myers, FL, May 2, 2011, a month before the closing of Anderson's Wigwam. Nearly \$1,000 for a round-trip plane ticket, rental car, gasoline, and lost wages ended up a small price to pay for the exact number the Wigwam seats.

I had counted the seats in the New Castle gym the previous October as part of a project to document the history of Ralph Legeman's 21 underground gyms and 26 others designed in his patented style. I found New Castle seats 7,829 as it sits today, not 9,325. That reminded me of when I was a student at Ball State 30 years ago. Someone from Anderson had said, "Everyone knows Anderson is bigger than New Castle." Debbie Riga, an Anderson graduate, now a PE teacher at Columbus North, told me she was confident the Wigwam seats more than 8,996. If the Wigwam could seat more than 1,000 fewer and still be larger than New Castle, I knew I had to count the seats. And when I read on the internet that the Wigwam would be closing more than three months before my next vacation, I had to make the \$1,000 trip.

When the Wigwam opened Nov. 22, 1961, the advertised capacity for basketball games was 8,189. The actual number I counted was 8,240. Some sources say the 22 rows of bleachers on the stage were added after the 1962 season. I think it's more likely the stage seats were always there but were used only for sectionals and regionals. Those 882 seats give the Wigwam a total of 9,122 seats, 124 more than advertised. During the regular season the seats were rolled back and the stage was occupied by the band.

I spent more than four hours May 3 photographing and counting seats in the Wigwam. Counting was more complicated than I had anticipated. Each row of floor level on the west side had three more seats than corresponding rows on the east. An internet story said the stage seats had been removed. The maintenance staff told me the undercarriage for the seats is no longer safe. The bleachers are chained to the wall but are, in fact, still there. The gym is a ticket printer's nightmare. Each aisle is two seats wide. The numbers are on the bleachers in the aisle ways even though the seats don't exist. The arched roof trusses are anchored just behind the top row of seats. They hang low enough to block out more numbers that can't be sold as seats.

I used my notes to compile a seating chart that night. I found four spots in the gym where I had doubts about the notes. I drove back to Anderson the next day to clear up those doubts and make sure I had the right number of seats. At that point, I drove on to New Castle to ask to see the temporary

seats—and measure them if they weren't numbered.

When the gym opened Nov. 21, 1959, a banner on the south wall read, as one does today, THE LARGEST AND FINEST HIGH SCHOOL FIELDHOUSE IN THE WORLD. Simple arithmetic showed that New Castle needed between three and four more rows of seats to make either of the advertised numbers of 9,325 or 9,314. At least two rows of temporary seats were needed to seat more than Anderson. I had been to more than a dozen sessions at New Castle and had never seen the temporary seats.

Athletic Director Mike Bergum was gone for a conference. Athletic Secretary Cheryl Betten said she couldn't remember seeing all of the temporary bleachers set up, but she had seen them used on the upper corners. When I asked her how I could see the seats. she pulled something better from the files. She gave me a copy of the fieldhouse seating chart, likely drawn by architect Ralph Legeman, himself, that shows four rows of bleachers behind the 24 rows of permanent seats. Floor-level scoreboards were added for November 1979 that eliminated 12 of the original 7,841 permanent seats. Temporary seats in the top corners of the gym increased the original capacity to 8,321. More temporary seats added to the long sides of the concourse made the true capacity 9,249.

Unlike the Wigwam, New Castle's seats are easy to count. The highest-numbered seat in each row indicates the total number of seats in each row. That's true for all rows of permanent seats. In the temporary bleachers, though, the north side of the gym has four rows of seats while the south side has three rows. The last row of temporary seats in the north corners are full rows while the south corners are half rows. Consequently, three rows of temporary seats don't begin with Seat 1. Section E, Row 28 has no seats 1-28. Section H, row 28 has no seats 1-32. And Section K, Row 28 has no seats 1-20. Counting the highest-numbered seat in each row and failing to subtract the missing 80 gives a total of 9,329.

That likely was rounded down to the easier-to-remember, 9,325. The floor-level scoreboards eliminated Section F, Row 1, seats 3-8 and Section L, Row 1, seats 4-9, a total of 12. The seating chart shows seats 4-8 eliminated in both sections for a total of 10. Evidently, someone split the difference

between the 12 seats actually eliminated and the 10 eliminated on the seating chart to change the original 9,325 to 9,314.

I couldn't help but shake my head as I flew back to Fort Myers. Answering the question of which is bigger doesn't really end the argument. Anderson is bigger than New Castle but not bigger than New Castle can be. Strange but true.

#### PARTIAL RALPH EARL LEGEMAN BIO

Ralph Earl Legeman was born in Evansville July 2, 1904. He graduated from Evansville Central High School in 1921. A year later he began work for architects Clifford Shopbell, F.E. Fowler and Edward Thole. He later partnered with Fowler, then Thole. In 1940, the firm became Ralph Legeman Associates. Post-WWII, Legeman began to experiment with cost-cutting new materials and new designs, especially for school buildings. In 1948, he applied for a patent for excavated gymnasiums with the playing floor at the bottom and permanent seats rising to a concourse surrounding the top row of seats that sat level with the outside grade level. The patent was granted in September 1956. He designed 19 basketball gymnasiums, two hockey rinks, and the house he shared with his third wife (he was twice widowed) in the patented style. He retired in 1972. He died on July 3, 1974 at the age of 70.
